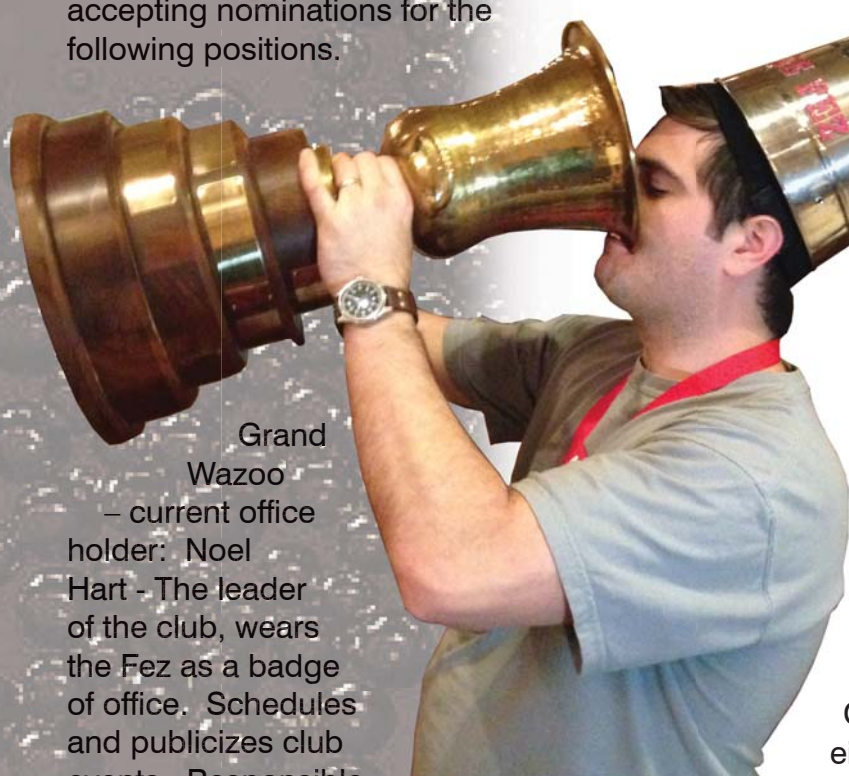

Time commitment: Increases as October approaches

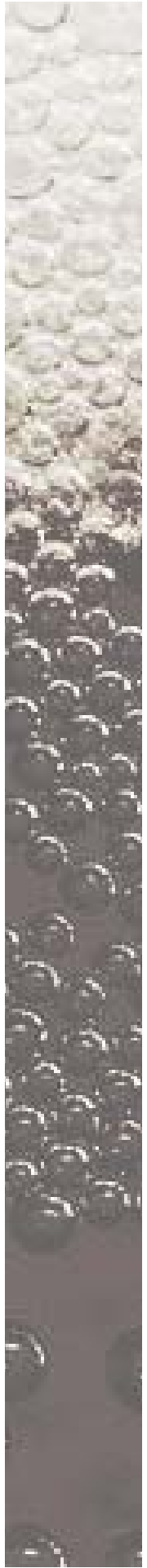

## India Pale Ales

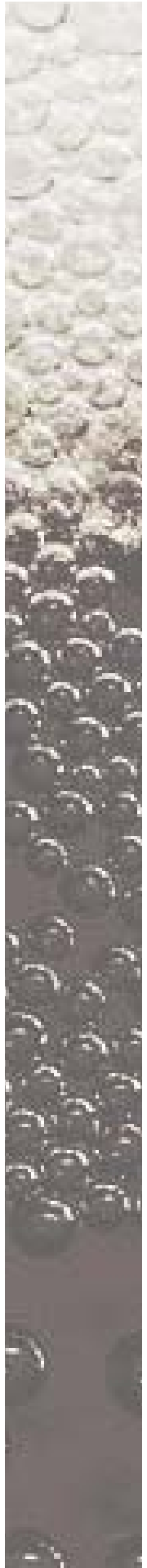
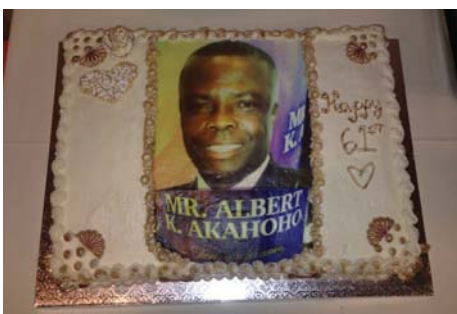


It's pretty common knowledge that the name "India Pale Ale" (often shortened to just "IPA") was derived from a type of pale ale that began being shipped to India in the late 1700's. Initially, beers were shipped from England to India due to extremely low export rates since most goods were coming from India to England. Eventually, Burton brewers were increasing levels of hop acids in order to take advantage their preservative qualities and making sure that less residual sugar, which tend to attract spoilage organisms, was present in the final beer. The Burton water source for producing these IPAs was perfect in terms of hardness and sulfate content. This style of beer was not only drunk abroad, but also locally in Britain throughout the 19th century.

The style began to decline around 1900 with the importance of the India market shrinking and then the onset of World War I. Heavy taxation forced brewers to scale back the amount of malt used in beer manufacturing. The lower gravity beer also meant cutting back on hops so that the beer would remain balanced. By World War II, the IPA style was pretty much out of existence. Although still marketed as an "IPA" by many British breweries, they had evolved into standard strength pale ales.

U.S. craft breweries revitalized the IPA in the 1980's and it saw a huge resurgence in the 1990's. However, the new American version was quite different with several varieties of stateside hops being utilized. Additionally, a "cleaner" yeast tends exemplify this particular style. Today, American IPAs are very popular not only in the U.S., but also in Europe. One source claims that the amount of U.S. made craft beer exported

into Europe jumped from 440,000 gallons in 2003 to 1.5 million gallons in 2009 (a 246% increase). It wouldn't be farfetched to assume that the numbers have seen a similar drastic boost from 2009 to today. And one could deduct that these substantial rises in export volumes are surely spearheaded by the ever swelling affinity of people's palates to the American IPA. Cheers!
